The Core

Theory of Knowledge

Interdisciplinary / Explores the nature of knowledge across disciplines / Encouraging an appreciation of other cultural perspectives

Extended Essay

4,000 words / Offers the opportunity to investigate a research question of individual interest / Familiarises students with the independent research and writing skills expected at university

Creativity, Action, Service (CAS)

Encourages students to be involved in artistic pursuits, sports and community service / Education outside the classroom / Development of the learner profile



IB Assessment

Diploma Programme assessment includes both final examinations and internal assessment undertaken by the teacher to IB criteria and then externally moderated by the IB.

All 4,000 examiners are 'quality checked' through a process of moderation.

The IB undertakes random inspections of schools during exams.

The diploma is graded over **45 points** giving ample scope to differentiate student ability.

Marks awarded for each course range from 1 (lowest) to 7 (highest). Diploma is awarded to students who gain at least 24 points.

The overall diploma pass rate is broadly consistent year on year.



EXTERNAL ASSESSMENTS / COMPONENTS

- A) All subjects (except visual arts) have 2 – 3 final written examinations in May of 12th grade. Exams taken at school marked by external examiners.
- B) Written Assignments in groups 1-2, EE, and TOK.

INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

All subjects have an internal assessment component. Course work done in 11th – 12th grades; evaluated by ISG teacher; sent to external examiners for moderation.

FINAL GRADE: 1 – 7 FOR OF EACH OF SIX MAIN SUBJECTS

Written exams at end of 12th grade = 75 – 80% of final subject grade Internal assessment throughout 2 IB years = 20 – 25% of final subject grade

Intellectual Vitality


Strong intellectual vitality is demonstrated by students who:
