## IB Group 1 - Studies in Language and Literature

- English A Literature (HL or SL)
- Italian A Literature (HL or SL)


## IB Group 2 - Language Acquisition

o English B (HL or SL)

- French B (HL or SL)
- French ab initio (SL only)
- Italian B (HL or SL)
- Italian ab initio (SL only)
- Spanish B (HL or SL)
- Spanish ab initio (SL only)


# IB Subjects - Groups 3-4 

IB Group 3 - Individuals and Societies

- Economics (HL or SL)
- History (HL or SL)

IB Group 4-Sciences

- Biology (HL or SL)
- Chemistry (HL or SL)
- Physics (HL or SL)


## IB Subjects - Groups 5-6

IB Group 5 - Mathematics

- Mathematical Studies (SL only)
- Mathematics (SL)
- Mathematics (HL)

IB Group 6 - The Arts

- Visual Arts (HL or SL)


## What choices must I make?

- Choosing 6 SUBJECTS:
- First four subjects - choose one subject from each of IB groups 1, 3, 4, and 5
- Fifth subject - choose an additional language, either from IB group 1 or 2
- Sixth subject - choose EITHER visual arts (group 6) OR any other subject from group 2, 3, or 4
- Choosing the LEVELS of those 6 subjects:
- 3 subjects at higher level and
- 3 subjects at standard level (math studies and language ab initio only exist at SL)


# Are there any limits to my choices? 

- Number of requests for any given subject
- Scheduling conflicts
- Suitability of subject for student


## How do I know which IB subjects are right for me?

oWhere are your strengths?
oWhat are your preferences?

- Talk to your teachers
$\bigcirc$ Review your grades from $9^{\text {th }}-10^{\text {th }}$ grades
oConsider your university plans, in particular:
oMedicine
- Engineering
oSome economics courses
oWill they accept Math Studies? English B?
oDo you want Italian equipollenza?
$\bigcirc$ Remember to maintain balance!


## How do I know what IB subjects I need for university?

- UK and some other European universities: Courses generally require a specific overall total and certain scores in required HL subjects. http://search.ucas.com/
- USA: Except for "technical" universities (e.g. MIT, CaITech), US colleges and universities will not express any preference for any IB subjects. The most selective universities may make distinctions based on the degree of difficulty of your subjects and levels. https://bigfuture.collegeboard. org/find-colleges and http://www.ibo.org/university-admission/recognition-of-the-ib-diploma-by-countries-and-universities/
- Italian universities: Generally require IB diploma with equipollenza; may also have entrance exams.

## How do I know if my choices meet Italian equivalency?

In all cases, you need to meet IB requirements first.
IN ADDITION, you also need to meet the following requirements:

- Maturità linguistica:
- Must have first language (language A literature) HL
$0 \quad 6^{\text {th }}$ subject must be a third language ( SL or HL )
- Maturità scientifica:
- Must have mathematics HL
$06^{\text {th }}$ subject must be chemistry, biology, or visual arts (SL or HL)
- Maturità di scienze umane:
o Must have history HL
- $6^{\text {th }}$ subject must be economics (SL or HL )
