- 1st subject a 1st language from group 1
- 2nd subject a 2nd language, EITHER from group 1 OR 2
- 3rd 5th subjects one subject EACH from groups 3, 4, and 5
- 6th subject −EITHER visual arts (group 6) OR any other subject from group 2, 3, or 4

- 3 subjects at higher level and
- 3 subjects at standard level



What about the core?

Participation in all three core components is mandatory for all full IB diploma candidates.



Are there any limits posed by ISG on my choices?

Yes, there can be!

- Number of requests for any given subject
- Scheduling conflicts
- Suitability of subject for student

N.B. Just because a given subject, or a particular scheduled combination of subjects, was ever made available at any time in the past does not guarantee that it will be made available in the future.



How do I know which IB subjects are right for me?

- Where are your strengths?
- What are your preferences?
- Talk to your teachers
- •Review your grades from 9th 10th grades
- Consider your university plans, in particular:
 - Medicine
 - Engineering
 - Some economics courses
 - Will they accept Math Studies? English B?
- ODo you want Italian equipollenza?
- Remember to maintain balance! There are no easy IB subjects, and all of them will require effort and commitment.



How do I know what IB subjects I need for university?

- <u>UK and some other European universities</u>: Courses generally require a specific overall total and certain scores in required HL subjects. See <u>UCAS Search</u> for more information.
- USA: Except for "technical" universities (e.g. MIT, CalTech), US colleges and universities will not express any preference for any IB subjects. The most selective universities may make distinctions based on the degree of difficulty of your subjects and levels. See the College Board Big Future and the IB's recognition websites for more information.
- <u>Italian universities</u>: Generally require IB diploma with <u>equipollenza</u>; may also have entrance exams.

How do I know if my choices meet Italian equivalency?

In all cases, you need to meet IB requirements first. IN ADDITION, you also need to meet the following requirements:

Maturità linguistica:

- HL requirement: first language (language A) HL preferably Italian
- 6th subject requirement: must be a third language (SL or HL)

Maturità scientifica:

- HL requirement: mathematics HL
- 6th subject requirement: chemistry, biology, or visual arts (SL or HL)

Maturità di scienze umane:

- HL requirement: history HL
- 6th subject requirement: economics (SL or HL)

IB Assessment Overview

All group 1 – 6 subjects graded on a scale of 1 – 7. EE and TOK graded on a scale of A – E (A being the highest).

- - Groups 1 5: final papers in May of 12th grade
 - Groups 1 2: Also have written assignments
 - Group 6 V. Arts: comparative study & process portfolio (60%)
- Groups 1 6 Internal Assessment: 20 30% of final grade
 - Groups 1 5: IA work in each subject (oral exams in groups 1 2, historical investigation, economics commentaries, scientific exploration in group 4, or math exploration or project)
 - Group 6 V. Arts: exhibition (40%)
- Core:
 - Extended Essay: just the essay
 - TOK: essay (67%) + presentation (33%)
 - CAS: program completion





Earning the IB Diploma

- 1. CAS requirements have been met.
- 2. The candidate's **total points are 24 or more**.
- 3. There is no "N" awarded for theory of knowledge, the extended essay or for a contributing subject.
- 4. There is no grade E awarded for theory of knowledge and/or the extended essay.
- 5. There is no grade 1 awarded in a subject/level.
- 6. There are no more than two grade 2s awarded (HL or SL).
- 7. There are no more than three grade 3s or below awarded (HL or SL).
- 8. The candidate has gained 12 points or more on HL subjects.
- The candidate has gained 9 points or more on SL subjects.
- 10. The candidate has not received a penalty for academic misconduct from the Final Award Committee.



A word about academic honesty

Academic honesty is an essential principle of the IB's academic programmes that enhances the organization's credibility and position as a leader in international education. As stated in the IB learner profile, all members of the IB community strive to be "principled", acting with "integrity and honesty, with a strong sense of fairness, justice and respect for the dignity of the individual, groups and communities".
